Tasmanian "Local Hero"

(Australian of the Year)

5000 citizens all over Australia were nominated this year for this Award that has four categories:

1. Australian of the Year
2. Senior Australian of the Year
3. Young Australian of the Year
4. Australia's Local Hero

Each category has 4 nominations in each Australian state and ACT. Out of the 5000 original nominations there were 128 selected for the first round (4 categories x 4 candidates for each category x 8 states/territory). Viktor Zappner was nominated in the 'Local Hero' category in Tasmania. That by itself was a welcome and unusual tribute to jazz.

Viktor said "I was happy that through it, maybe, the status of jazz in Tasmania will be strengthened and, also, that the reputation of Devonport Jazz Festival will be further enhanced."

On 21 November with his wife Eva, they travelled to Hobart to attend the presentation of Tasmanian Australian of the Year Awards. Not expecting to win in that competition they were admiring the beautiful surrounding of the Meadowbank Estate, drank wine, talked to other people and enjoyed a warm Spring evening. When then, Lara Giddings, Premier of Tasmania, read Viktor's name as being a winner of the 'Local Hero' category it drastically intruded into his pleasant wine mist.

From now it's getting tough though. By now there are only 32 candidates left (4 categories x 8 states/territory).

On 24 January Viktor and Eva will be flown to Canberra where on 25 January the final 4 winners will be announced by the Prime Minister in front of Parliament House. Viktor say's; Just a presence of a jazz musician among the nominees at that ceremony looks rather eccentric, but this is simply Australia. Be it as it may, on 26 January, together with 20 million Australians all over the country, we will celebrate there our AUSTRALIA DAY.

Music started at 6.30pm an hour earlier than previous years because we had 34 musicians to fit into a wonderful night of jazz. Actually some of the musos turned up on the Thursday night and played for management and locals, those being Bruce Gourlay, Terry Patterson, Elvern King & John Packham (banjo –& friend of Bruce). The night rolled along well & was most appreciated by a full house of jazz lovers. The audience could not stop talking about the wonderful venue food & staff, with all this it was looking to be a great festival. Music finished about 10.30pm. Next morning music started before 10.00am & continued throughout the day, even though there was no programmed music muso's just kept hopping up to strut their stuff & as a result of this we had nearly a full house all day enjoying the very talented musicians. There was a break before dinner then the programmed music started again through till a bit after 10.30pm.

Sunday morning once again saw these very anxious muso's up on the stage by 10.00am continuing on with the entertainment, this continued through till late afternoon when we had another break before dinner. Over the weekend we had some wonderful combos; this included several very talented young guitarists from the conservatorium of music (students of Alan Brown) perform for us & what talent that was; his group included Alan Brown & Neil Heather. Also included in quite a few of these combos was hotel manager John Hay who sat in on drums & did it very well.

At this stage I would very much like to thank all those musicians for giving up their time to make this festival possible & for their co-operation in sticking to their time slots to make the programme run smoothly. I would also like to thank John & Sandra for providing us with such a superb venue at great rates & for the wonderful staff who could not do enough for us. Some of the staff said they wished we would have a festival every month.
